

Breakfast Club and Teatime Club

To ensure that we have correct staff: pupil ratios and sufficient food, <u>all children attending breakfast club</u> and/or Teatime Club must be booked and paid for in advance via ParentPay.

Breakfast Club booked in advance will cost £1.50 per child/per day. If children turn up and are not booked in, this will cost £2 per child/per day.





Teatime Club can only be booked by parents if you have completed registration forms. Please see the office if you would like to register. There are currently 3 booking options and all include a light snack:

3pm - 4pm - cost £3 per child

4pm - 5pm - cost £3 per child (if your child is attending another club from 3pm-4pm)

3pm-5pm-cost £5 per child



There is a late collection charge of £15, per child, for every 30 minutes or part thereof, after 5pm.

**Free event but visitor entrance charges apply. Workshop tickets are free and available each day on a first come, first served basis.





There will be sessions on the following Wednesdays from 7-8 PM:


